I got a call while cleaning the house and immediately knew it was a Romanian number. These calls always give me a bit of anxiety because I know I'm not going to know what they're saying. But thankfully, this time, Catalina was at our house that morning helping me clean. So after I answered and clearly had no idea what was going on, I took the phone to her and she was kind enough to speak for me. It was the doctor's office asking if I could come today for an appointment at 1 pm instead of Friday. Thankfully it worked out, so I agreed. But it also meant I had to rush to finish everything and get there on time.

So after riding the dubita (the minibus) from Codlea to the Brasov bus station, I got a taxi instead of using the bus system. I'm getting better at using VERY basic sentences to tell the drive where I need to go rather than just pointing on my phone to an address and asking "Ok?" But it's still very clear that I'm a foreigner, and they usually know within an instant that I must speak English. This taxi driver was no different and immediately started speaking English to me, as well.

In fact, I spoke to him in Romanian as much as possible and he would go back and forth between Romanian and English and was kind enough to even ask if I preferred that he speak more Romanian for practice. He was actually willing to teach me words and correct me during our drive. He told me that he moved to Brasov for better job opportunities from another Romanian city; he has a wife and one daughter; and he learned English by watching movies! He told me his
